**METHODOLOGY:** Fabrizio, Lee & Associates conducted a nationwide online survey of 2,000 self-identified 2016 General Election voters from an online panel on November 17-21, 2016. Geography, race/ethnicity, gender, age, party, and the Presidential ballot were weighted to match the population of 2016 voters nationwide according to the results of turnout and exit polls. Respondents were randomly selected from an online opt-in panel of known registered voters. The margin of sampling error at the 95% confidence interval for 2,000 voters is  $\pm 2.19\%$ .

### **KEY FINDINGS:**

✓ **President-elect Donald Trump's image has improved markedly since Election Day:**

In our survey, 46% of voters have a favorable opinion of President-elect Trump, while 51% have an unfavorable opinion of him. While 5-points negative, this is a significant improvement from where he stood less than two weeks ago on Election Day. According to the exit polls, only 38% of voters had a favorable view of Mr. Trump and 60% had an unfavorable view. This amounts to a staggering 17-point positive net improvement for the President-Elect since Election Day.

✓ **A clear majority of voters approve of the job President-elect Trump is doing so far:**

Even more telling of his initial success is that a majority of 2016 voters approve of the job Mr. Trump is doing as President-Elect, 55% - 45%, a +10 net approval rating. Independents approve of the President-Elect's performance by a similar 13-point margin, and even 23% of Democrats approve of the job he is doing.

✓ **President-elect Trump is exceeding many voters' expectations on his performance thus far outpacing those who say they are disappointed by better than a 2 to 1 margin:**

Voters were also asked if they believed Mr. Trump has performed better, worse, or about the same as they expected him to since he was elected. The President-elect is strongly exceeding expectations, with 34% of voters saying he has performed better than expected, compared to only 14% that think he is doing worse than expected (+20). Independents are also significantly more likely to believe President-elect Trump is doing better than worse (28% - 11%) and Democrats are nearly split (21% - 24%).

✓ **By an overwhelming majority, voters say the election is over and it's time to give President-elect Trump a chance:**

Since Donald Trump was elected President, the news coverage has largely portrayed a nation split with huge numbers of people disputing the results of the election. However, the truth is that the overwhelming majority of the American electorate believes President-elect Trump should be given the chance to do the job. When asked, 82% of 2016 voters agree with the statement, *“Regardless of who you voted for, the election is over and we have a final result. It is time to give President-elect Trump a chance to do the job he was elected for.”* The belief that Mr. Trump be given the chance to do the job he was elected for is so strong that even a majority of Hillary Clinton's voters (64%) agree with the above statement. In fact, as shown below, a clear majority of all racial/ethnic and partisan groups agree that it's time to give Mr. Trump a chance.

**Bottom Line:** Since winning the election, President-elect Trump is performing well and exceeding expectations. With a majority approving of his job performance and his image greatly improving, it's clear that the American people, even some who did not vote for him, feel that Mr. Trump is taking America in the right direction and he has earned the right to do the job he was elected for.
